The Hannah Frank 110th birthday exhibition at Glasgow University opens on Monday 19 November and runs to 6 February.

Hannah Frank was a Glasgow Jewish artist who was born 110 years ago in 1908. She died in 2008 just before her 100th birthday and was awarded a posthumous degree by Glasgow University.

There will be an opening reception at 7.30pm on Sunday 18 November with speaker Alice Strang from Scottish National Galleries, the film "Hannah Frank, The Spark Divine", a kosher buffet sponsored by SCoJeC, and music from Glasgow's The Bunch of Klezmer. Part of Scottish Interfaith Week.
